Youth in South Asia: Strategizing Life and Reshaping the Society

Currently, young people in South Asian societies constitute the majority of its population. The generation born after the 1990s has grown up amid rapid social changes such as diversification in economic opportunities and job options, the spread of education, fast urbanization, media entanglements, and information flow, and mobility that has significantly increased compared to their earlier generations. They are bringing about major changes in the political economy and social relations in South Asia. However, their potentials are severely limited and obstructed – some are favored at the expenses of others – and the latter majority are negotiating to overcome their situations in various ways while they recognize their "uncertain" present and the bleak future as well. This symposium aims to shed light on the social changes in South Asia through young people's life strategies in the "age of uncertainty." For instance, how do young people's political and economic sensibilities and risk responses contribute to changes in social landscapes to the state policy and market relations with what they are in constant negotiation? We try to capture social changes amid the "uncertainty" in question from the experiences of the actors, namely, young people's sense of and relationship with society. By capturing social change in the context of individual strategies (and its cumulative affects), it is possible to understand the process of how South Asian societies are transforming with the changing youth. Understanding the experiences and social responses of young people living in this era is important for understanding how society, including its political economy, is shifting.
